21: General architectural description:

Oriented to the south, this H-shaped Modern Movements church building rests on a concrete foundation. It is constructed of tan brick. The building has a cross-gabled roof covered in asphalt shingles. The primary entry, a set of glass double doors, is located within a cube-like, double-height, glass entry vestibule. The two-story sanctuary with a front-gabled roof is centered on the façade. It features a projecting central panel of decorative concrete. There is a brick tower with a light colored cement top located east of the sanctuary. There are two entries, one on either side of the central sanctuary. Each entry is a pair of double glass doors with fixed pane transoms. These recessed doors are located within a window wall, with the divided lite flanking windows. There are three square brick columns located near each front entrance and supporting the overhanging side-gabled roof. The each flanking bay of the symmetrical façade also has at least four narrow, rectangular windows (bottom may be operable).

The H-shaped plan is most visible on the east and west elevations of the church. On the east side there are no openings in the front-gabled

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projections which form the ends of the "H." The east-facing central bay has a centered secondary entry, a frosted glass door with a narrow fixed pane transom, which is reached via a paved walkway with a simple metal railing. All three elevations which form a courtyard on the east side have narrow rectangular windows matching those on the façade. A two-story portion of the building with a front gabled roof appears below this central portion of the church on the east elevation. At the northeast corner there is a lower, front gabled, brick addition with a central bay of white stucco (or weatherboard) and a centered double door. Adjacent to this addition there is a fenced area with a large satellite dish. North of the addition there is a gated area for the dumpster/large recycling bin. There are two doors on the west elevation, one facing the internal courtyard and offering access to the Family History Center, and another facing west and centered on the south, front-gabled projection. Both doors appear to be glass with narrow fixed pane transoms. The inward facing elevations all feature narrow rectangular windows like those found on both the façade and the east elevation. The brick in the north, front-gabled projection appears to be slightly darker than the brick used elsewhere on the church.

The north (rear) elevation has a centered, second-story, front-gabled section with no window openings. The long rectangular first story has a slightly projecting central portion with twelve narrow, rectangular windows arranged in six pairs. There are recessed secondary entries on the two corners of this central projection; the double doors match those on the façade. There are five narrow rectangular windows on the rectangular bays at both the northeast and northwest corners of the building.

Character-defining features of the Modern Movements style evident at 600 E. Swallow Road include: the soaring two story sanctuary with the central decorative concrete band, symmetrical design, recessed entries, and narrow rectangular windows.

35. Historical background:

This building was constructed in 1977; however, Mormons have been in Fort Collins since 1830. From the 1940s to the present day, many students from Utah have moved to the city to attend Colorado State University and then have remained in Fort Collins. This chapel was constructed based upon a standard plan, known as a Stevens church, from the Mormon Church in Salt Lake City. Tyler A. Wooley, the church leader (also known as a stake leader) at the time of construction, chose the Stevens design from the two available Mormon standard plans because it offered additional teaching areas and extra room in the choir loft. This plan also features a cultural hall resembling a gymnasium with a stage. An article in the *Coloradoan* described this chapel as "a simple multipurpose building which stands in accordance with the Mormon hierarchy." This church is home to the Family History Center, a genealogical research facility.

42. Statement of Significance:

This building has been home to the Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints since its construction in 1977. Architecturally, this Mormon standard plan church is a good example of Modern Movements style. Character-defining features include the soaring two story sanctuary with the central decorative concrete band, symmetrical design, recessed entries, and narrow rectangular windows. This level of historical and architectural significance is not sufficient for this property to qualify for individual listing in the National Register of Historic Places. According to the Colorado Office of Archaeology and Historic Preservation, this church is eligible for listing in the Colorado State Register of Historic Properties (Criterion C: Architecture). It also qualifies for designation as a Fort Collins Landmark.

43. Assessment of historic physical integrity related to significance:

Constructed in 1977, this building exhibits a high level of physical integrity relative to the seven aspects of integrity as defined by the National Park Service and the Colorado Historical Society: location, setting, design, materials, workmanship, association, and feeling. The front-gabled, shed-like projection on the east elevation, if it is an addition, has virtually no effect on the overall integrity of this church. The building retains sufficient physical integrity to convey its architectural significance for listing on the State Register and as a Fort Collins Landmark.


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
SKETCH MAP
