21. General architectural description:

Oriented to the east, this duplex building rests on a concrete foundation. Green stucco clads the majority of the exterior walls. However, a concrete brick veneer extends up approximately 4 feet from the foundation on the symmetrical front (east) façade. Covering the rest of the façade, including all of a front-gabled bay protruding from the elevation, are green-painted, square-cut wood shingles. Windows are 1-beside-1-light, sliding sash, with aluminum frames. The larger window openings are tripartite, with the center light fixed. The gabled-bay at the center of the façade hosts a pair of 16-panel, steel, overhead-retractable garage doors, painted white. Doorways open in the north and south elevations of the protruding bay. They host 6-panel wood doors, painted white, and opening behind aluminum-frame storm doors. Secondary doorways open in the center of the rear (west) elevation. Brown, interlocking asphalt shingles cover the cross-gabled roof, and white-painted wood fascia and soffit box the eaves.

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This property is located on terrain sloping downward from northeast to southwest, with an elevation of around 4,700 feet above mean sea level. The neighborhood features modest 1- and 2-story houses and apartment buildings. Setbacks from West Street are generally the same on this block. This property is situated on the southwest corner of West and West 15th streets. Separating the street from the sidewalk is a gravel-covered strip. A planted-grass yard, with mature landscaping, covers the lot. Spanning much of the eastern edge of the property, west of the sidewalk, is a massive hedge of junipers. Encircling the back yard is a chain-link fence, and a wood privacy fence delimits the northern edge of the property.

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Statement of significance:

Because this property is less than 50 years old and does not meet any of criteria considerations A through G, it is ineligible for listing in the National Register of Historic Places. Moreover, the architectural and historical significance are not to the extent that the property would qualify for individual listing in the Colorado State Register of Historic Properties or as a City of Pueblo landmark. Given its age, the property should not be considered a contributing resource within any potential historic district.

43. Assessment of historic physical integrity related to significance:

Constructed in 1971, this duplex exhibits a high level of physical integrity relative to the seven aspects of integrity as defined by the National Park Service and the Colorado Historical Society: location, setting, design, materials, workmanship, feeling, and association. It has not been notably altered since its construction. This property retains sufficient physical integrity to convey its architectural and historical significance.

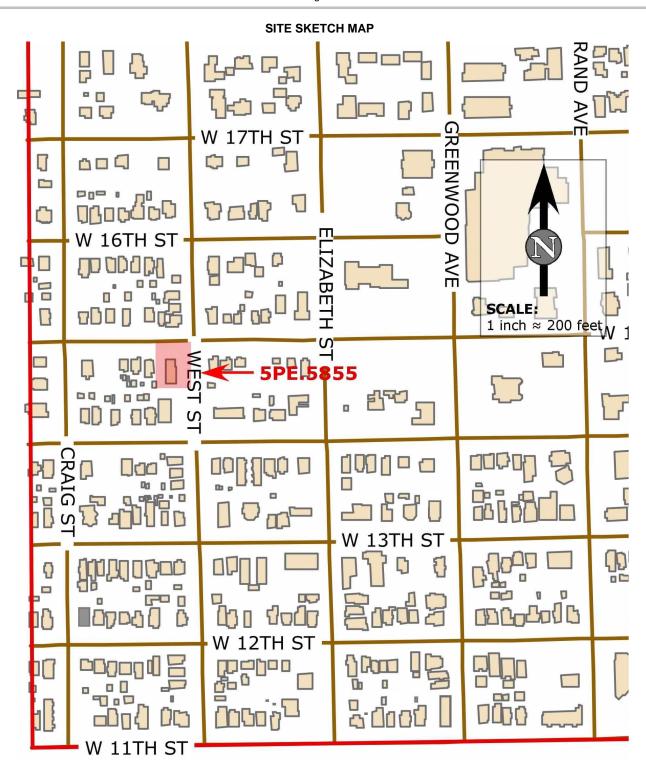

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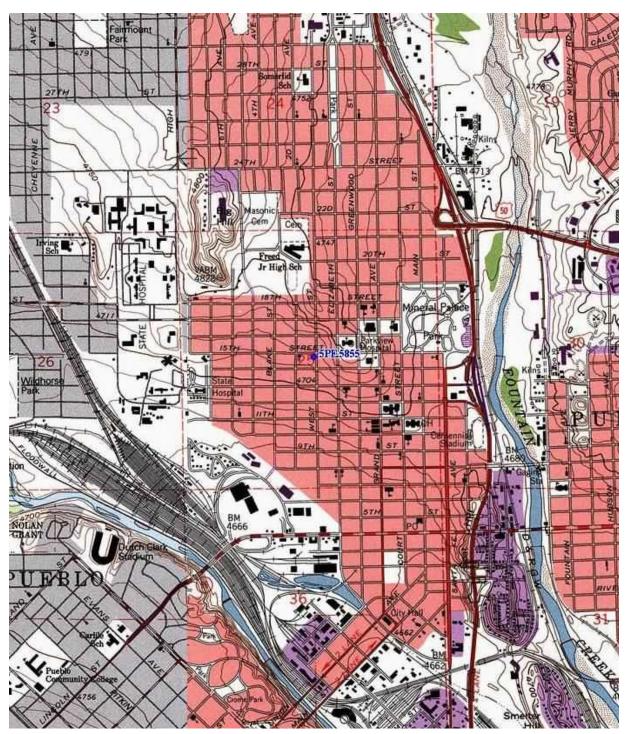
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LOCATION MAP
